## **Administration**

Eric moved to approve minutes with a second from Jeanne. Minutes were approved.

## **Local Board Visit**

The 3<sup>rd</sup> Judicial District Local Board was present to discuss issues with the Board. A separate local board report was done to document the discussion.

## **Financial**

The FY2016 funding plan has been completed. An overview of FY2015 was given, including the review of the board's overhead account, which has just under \$350,000 available for Board-approved projects.

## **Assessment Discussions**

Alex Walker provided an update on the SOA-R subcommittee work. Established under the old IAC, this committee is addressing issues with the state's existing assessment/tx matching tools. The committee has developed the Colorado Assessment Match (CAM) and it needs to be tested and validated. A validation study proposal was presented that will cost \$90,000. The Board voted 6-0 to use \$90,000 out of the overhead account to support this study. It will take up to a year and is slated to being in January.

Jagruti Shah provided an update on the JBBS program and its assessment practices which vary by program. All programs are required to perform mental health, substance use, trauma and TBI assessments. Eight programs are also doing risk assessments. The Board determined that all assessment practices need to be discussed and the Board needs to determine if standard practices should exist and what those might look like.

## **Affordable Care Act**

A review of the BHO provider lists was done and it was determined to send the lists to the local boards, TASC (DOC) and Chief Probation Officers. The goal is to get local communities working to connect existing SUD providers with the BHO and also to start discussions with existing BHO providers that may not be familiar with the need for criminal justice SUD tx. It was further discussed that there may be ways in which state agencies can partner with HCPF to track the ACA/Medicaid impact on outpatient treatment.
