Juror Questions. Jurors shall be allowed to submit written questions to the court for the court to ask of witnesses during trial, after notice to the parties and an opportunity to be heard, and in compliance with other procedures established by the trial court and announced to the parties prior to trial. Upon request, the trial court shall permit appropriate follow-up questions from the parties within the scope of the jurors' questions. The trial court shall have the discretion to prohibit or limit questioning in a particular trial for reasons related to the severity of the charges, the presence of significant suppressed evidence or for other good cause.

COMMITTEE COMMENT

Trial judges should inquire at the end of the parties' questioning of each witness whether the jury has questions of that witness.
