SUBJECT: Rotation of County Court Judges to Longmont

This order updates 20th Judicial District Administrative Order 01-101 and replaces versions dated March 20, 2001, December 2, 2011 and June 22, 2016.

Each assignment of a county court judge to Longmont shall begin the Tuesday following the Martin Luther King holiday weekend of each year subject to modification by the Chief Judge in consultation with the county court judges in the event of special circumstances.

Upon appointment of a new county court judge, that judge shall be placed in the former judge's position in the rotation schedule and will rotate to Longmont after a minimum of two years' experience on the bench unless otherwise modified at the discretion of the Chief Judge.

Subject to the approval of the Chief Judge, judges may exchange years as may better suit their circumstances.

The period of assignment is one year; however, a judge may serve up to two years upon request subject to veto by the next judge in line for assignment. In no event may a judge serve for longer than two years during an assignment, except as otherwise modified at the discretion of the Chief Judge.
