



Honorable (Ret.) Vincent R. White

Judge White graduated from North Carolina State University in 1986 and from North Carolina Central University School of Law in 1990. He then became an officer in the United States Air Force and joined its Judge Advocate Corps where he practiced at Homestead Air Force Base in Miami, Florida. Judge White continues to serve as a Reserve Judge Advocate General where he teaches at the United States Force Judge Advocate General School and holds the rank of Lt. Colonel in the Air Force Reserves.

Judge White is a member of the bars of the 8th, 9th and 10th Federal Circuits, the United States Court of Military Appeals and of the States of Colorado, Pennsylvania and North Carolina.

Judge White was appointed to the bench in 2004 and served as a District Court Judge until his retirement in December 2014. During his time on the bench he presided over thousands of civil, domestic relations, criminal, probate and mental health cases and trials. In each of the areas he presided he met or exceeded all American Bar Association standards for Judicial Officers.

In 2010, Judge White attended the National Judicial College Civil Mediation Course located in Reno, Nevada. After graduating from this course he became a certified mediator. He has subsequently become a faculty member for the National Judicial College teaching mediation skills and techniques to other fellow Judges from around the world. In 2012, Judge White created a "pro-bono" court-connected mediation program in Douglas County. In that capacity, Judge White provided hundreds of hours of mediation for low-income parties in domestic relations and civil cases for the District with a majority of cases resulting in full resolution.

Judge White's extensive legal background also includes service as a District Court Magistrate in the 17th Judicial District, the Colorado State Public Defender's Office, and the City Attorney's Office for the City of Colorado Springs. His most recent civilian service was in the Colorado Attorney General's Office where he was Deputy Attorney General for the Employment and Personnel Division. He also litigated civil cases in front of Federal and State District Courts involving Title VII, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Age Discrimination in Employment Act.
