Description of conditional water rights for which finding of reasonable diligence is sought: The following water rights were decreed by the District Court in and for Water Division No. 6 (the "Water Court") on November 26, 2001, in Case No. 00CW048. An Amended Order and Decree of the Water Court was entered on January 26, 2004, *nunc pro tunc* to November 26, 2001. The structures identified below have already been built, and the water rights decreed absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. The only decreed use for the described rights that remains conditional is augmentation. The appropriation date for each of the described water rights is May 3, 2000. A. South Fork Terrace Pond (1) Location: The center of the pond is located in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 28, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 400 feet from the West line and 1400 feet from the North line of said Section 28. This pond has a surface area of 1.32 acres. (2) Source: An unnamed tributary to the South Fork of the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 6.0 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. B. Middle Fork Cutthroat Pond No. 1 (1) Location: The center point for this pond is located in the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 2900 feet from the East line and 1450 feet from the North line of said Section 21. This pond has a surface area of 2.34 acres. (2) Source: Unknown Creek and Upper Unknown Creek, tributary to the Middle Fork of the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 19.0 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. C. Middle Fork Cutthroat Pond No. 2 (1) Location: The center point for this pond is located in the SE 1/4, NW1/4 of Section 21, T. 12N., R. 86W., at a point approximately 3200 feet from the East Line and 1400 feet from the North line of said Section 21. This pond has a surface area of 0.81 acres. (2) Source: Unknown Creek and Upper Unknown Creek, tributaries to the Middle Fork of the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 6.0 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. D. Pratt Pond No. 1 (1) Location: The center point for this pond is located in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 18, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 250 feet from the East line and 50 feet from the North line of said Section 18. The pond has a surface area of 0.53 acres. (2) Source: Roaring Fork Creek, tributary to the Little

Snake River. (3) Amount: 4.2 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. E. Pratt Pond No. 2 (1) Location: The center point for this pond is located in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 18, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 300 feet from the East line and 200 feet from the North line of said Section 18. The pond has a surface area of 0.85 acres. (2) Source: Roaring Fork Creek, tributary to the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 6.8 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. F. Pratt Pond No. 3 (1) Location: The center point for this pond is located in the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 18, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 400 feet from the East line and 400 feet from the North line of said Section 18. The pond has a surface area of 1.15 acres. (2) Source: Roaring Fork Creek, tributary to the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 9.2 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. G. Upper Meadow Ponds (1) Location: The center of these ponds is located in the NW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 21, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 700 feet from the West line and 400 feet from the North line of said Section 21. These ponds have a combined surface area of 2.25 acres. (2) Source: Middle Fork of the Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 10.1 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. H. Lower Meadow Oxbow Lakes (1) Location: The center of the ponds is located in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 17, T. 12 N., R. 86 W., at a point approximately 1900 feet from the South line and 800 feet from the West line of said Section 17. These lakes have a combined surface area of 1.68 acres. (2) Source: Little Snake River. (3) Amount: 10.9 acre-feet. (4) Uses: Absolute for recreational, piscatorial, and wildlife purposes. Conditional for augmentation. 4. Request to make the conditional use absolute or in the alternative a finding of reasonable diligence: The subject storage water rights have been constructed and are part of the integrated water supply system for Three Forks Ranch, a 50,000-acre ranch in Routt County, Colorado. The conditional augmentation use was decreed for these rights in the event the other available augmentation credits identified in the plan for augmentation in Case No. 00CW48 were insufficient in any month to replace the out-of-priority water depletions from the development on the ranch. Such releases have not yet been required, but may be necessary in the future. The continued availability of the identified rights for augmentation purposes remains important for Applicant's overall water supply plan. C.R.S. § 37-92-301(4)(e) provides that "a decreed conditional storage right shall be made absolute for all decreed purposes to the extent of the volume of the appropriation that has been captured, possessed, and controlled at the decreed storage structure." As a result of this statute, Applicant is entitled to make the augmentation use of the subject storage rights absolute. 5. Names and Addresses of Owners of Land upon which Structures are Located, upon which Water is or will be Stored, or upon which Water is or will be Placed to Beneficial Use: All structures are on land owned by Applicant. WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that this Court enter a decree that makes the augmentation use absolute, or in the alternative, enter a finding that Applicant has exercised reasonable diligence in the development of the conditional water rights so that the conditional status of the rights is continued.
