Motion to Amend Criminal Complaint and Information (P-003)		

On March 24, 2021 the People filed the original Criminal Complaint and Information against Ahmad Al Aliwi (the "Defendant"). Upon further consideration and investigation, the People are now moving to amend the Complaint and Information, specifically by amending certain current pending counts and adding several additional counts, as detailed below.

Colo. R. Crim. P. 7(e) permits the amendment of a complaint or information as to form or substance at any time prior to trial. Whether to permit an amendment is left to the sound discretion of the trial court. *See People v. Butler*, 224 P.3d 380 (Colo. App. 2009); *see also People v. Wright*, 678 P.2d 1072 (Colo. App. 1984). However, reviewing courts have favored a liberal application of Rule 7(e). *See Cervantes v. People*, 715 P.2d 783 (Colo. 1986); *see also People v. Al-Yousif*, 206 P.3d 824 (Colo. App. 2006).

Defendant is not prejudiced by the amended and added counts proposed by the People in this motion as the evidence supporting the counts is contained in the discovery already provided to Defendant in the above captioned case. The factual basis for the added charges originates from the

same incident and events previously disclosed to Defendant in discovery. Additionally, this case is in its infancy. The Court has yet to schedule a preliminary hearing in this matter.

The People move to amend Count 1 through Count 9, and Count 11 (Count 10 remains unchanged, edits to counts 1 through 11 are **in bold**), and further move to add Count 12 through Count 54, to read as follows:

COUNT 1-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Neven Stanisic**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 2-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Kevin Mahoney**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 3-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Tralona Bartkowiak**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 4-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Rikki Olds**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 5-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Denny Stong**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 6-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Lynn Murray**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 7-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully, feloniously, after deliberation, and with the intent to cause the death of a person other than himself, caused the death of **Teri Leiker**; in violation of section 18-3-102(1)(a), C.R.S.

COUNT 8-MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F1)

On or about March 22, 2021, by engaging in conduct constituting a substantial step toward the commission of murder in the first degree, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully and feloniously, under circumstances evidencing an attitude of universal malice manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life generally, knowingly engaged in conduct which created a grave risk of death to a person other than himself, and thereby attempted to cause the death of Deputy Jeffrey Brunkow. Further, the victim was a peace officer engaged in the performance of his duties; in violation of sections 18-3-102(1)(a), 18-3-107, and 18-2-101, C.R.S.

COUNT 43-CRIMINAL ATTEMPT TO COMMIT MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F2) (second law enforcement entry into King Soopers)

On or about March 22, 2021, by engaging in conduct constituting a substantial step toward the commission of murder in the first degree, Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully and feloniously, under circumstances evidencing an attitude of universal malice manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life generally, knowingly engaged in conduct which created a grave risk of death to a person other than himself, and thereby attempted to cause the death of Ranger Samuel Kilburn. Further, the victim was a peace officer engaged in the performance of his duties; in violation of sections 18-3-102(1)(a), 18-3-107, and 18-2-101, C.R.S.

COUNT 44-ASSAULT IN THE FIRST DEGREE (F3)

Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa, under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly engaged in conduct which created a grave risk of death to another, and thereby caused serious bodily injury to Elan Shakti; in violation of section 18-3-202(1)(c), C.R.S.

COUNT 45-LARGE CAPACITY MAGAZINE PROHIBITED – DURING CRIME (F6)

Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully sold, transferred or possessed a large capacity magazine. Further, the Defendant possessed the large capacity magazine during the commission of a felony or a crime of violence, namely: Murder in the First Degree and Criminal Attempt to Commit Murder in the First Degree, in violation of 18-12-302(1)(a),(c) C.R.S.

COUNT 46-LARGE CAPACITY MAGAZINE PROHIBITED – DURING CRIME (F6)

COUNT 54-LARGE CAPACITY MAGAZINE PROHIBITED – DURING CRIME (F6)

Ahmad Al Aliwi Alissa unlawfully sold, transferred or possessed a large capacity magazine. Further, the Defendant possessed the large capacity magazine during the commission of a felony or a crime of violence, namely: Murder in the First Degree and Criminal Attempt to Commit Murder in the First Degree, in violation of 18-12-302(1)(a),(c) C.R.S.

WHEREFORE, the People respectfully request that the Criminal Complaint and Information

filed in the above captioned case be amended to reflect the charging as detailed above.
