## Chapter 18 COLORADO COURT RULES RULES GOVERNING ADMISSION TO THE BAR

## Rule 201.3. CLASSIFICATION OF APPLICANTS

1) Class A applicants are those applicants as determined by the Bar Committee:

(a) who have been admitted to the Bar of another state, territory, or district of the United States which allows admission to members of the Colorado Bar on motion without the requirement of taking that jurisdiction's bar examination,

(b) who have actively and substantially maintained a practice of law for five of the seven years immediately preceding application for admission to the Bar of Colorado in that state, territory or district of the United States which allows admission to members of the Colorado Bar on motion without the requirement of taking that jurisdiction's bar examination, immediately preceding application to the admission of the Bar of Colorado, and.
(c) who have actively and substantially engaged in the

practice of law for five of the seven years immediately preceding application for admission to the Bar of Colorado.

(2) through (5) No Change.
