When official judicial business is conducted at the facilities of organizations which limit membership or admission, in policy or practice, on the basis of race, religion, gender, or national origin, the public perception of the fairness of the judicial system can be undermined. Therefore, judges and judicial department employees shall not conduct official business, including seminars, conferences and meetings, at nonpublic facilities which limit membership or admission, in policy or practice, on the basis of race, religion, gender, or national origin. No judicial department funds shall be expended in connection with any official business, including seminars, conferences and meetings, held at a nonpublic facility which limits membership or admission on the basis of race, religion, gender, or national origin.
