Juror Service for Hearing-Impaired People

The following directive is issued to provide guidance to Jury Commissioners when an accommodation is requested by a potential juror with a hearing impairment.

- 1. Upon notification by a hearing-impaired person summoned for jury duty, the Colorado Courts shall provide reasonable accommodation which will enable the person to serve as a juror.
- 2. To determine the reasonable accommodation, the jury commissioner will consult with the hearing-impaired person and discuss options which may include hearing-assistance devices, real-time transcription, sign language interpretation, or other options which may be suggested by the potential juror.
- 3. If necessary due to time constraints related to the availability of any of the agreed-upon accommodations, and at the court's discretion, the hearing-impaired individual's jury summons may be continued to allow the court time to provide the agreed-upon accommodation. If the juror's service is continued, the court will provide the agreed upon accommodation for the duration of any jury trial on which the hearing-impaired person serves.
- 4. The State of Colorado will provide and pay the reasonable costs of any of these services for the duration of any jury trial on which the hearing-impaired person serves.
