

Mike Maday provides mediation and training services to businesses, schools, families and the courts. He has 35 years' experience as a social worker with children and families. He started his mediation and training practice, Resolution Resources of Colorado in 1984 in Colorado Springs, specializing in family and civil mediation and conflict in education systems. He has mediated court ordered family, child protection and civil cases under contract with the Colorado Office of Dispute Resolution since he helped establish that program in Colorado Springs in cooperation with the courts in 1987. He is a certified mediator for Hague Convention cross-border child custody disputes. He also mediates Americans with Disabilities Act and special education disputes.

Mike has developed and implemented school-based conflict resolution programs that emphasize student mediation as a way to resolve conflicts. Mike has trained over four thousand people in negotiation, mediation and violence prevention skills including attorneys, mediators, business people, mental health professionals, teachers, parents and students from throughout North America and Europe. He has taught mediation at the University of Denver's Graduate School of Social Work, where he received a Master of Social Work Degree in 1984.
