II. Winston H. Conkling (“Applicant”) seeks a finding of reasonable diligence and to make absolute in part the conditional water rights decreed in Case No. 11CW87, District Court, Water Division 2 (“Decree”). In Case No. 18CW3037, Applicant was granted a finding of

reasonable diligence on a portion of these surface and storage rights, and a portion of the same was also made absolute. This application seeks an additional finding of reasonable diligence on the remaining conditional water rights, as well as to make additional storage rights absolute. **III.** The following conditional spring and reservoir rights are subject of this Application and are collectively referred to as the “Conkling Water Rights”: **Surface Water Spring.** Conkling Spring No.2. **Surface Water Storage.** Conkling Reservoir No.1. Conkling Reservoir No.2. Conkling Reservoir No.3. Conkling Reservoir No.4. Conkling Reservoir No.6. **IV. Decree Description for Conkling Water Rights.** Date of Original Decree: May 15, 2012. Case No.: 11CW87. Court: District Court, Water Division 2. Subsequent Decrees Awarding Findings of Diligence: Date of Decree: October 19, 2018. Case No.: 18CW3037. Court: District Court, Water Division 2. Conkling Spring No. 1. Located in the SW 1/4 Section 11, Township 20 South, Range 70 West of the 6th P.M., in a spring of water at a point whence the southwest corner of said Section 11, bears north two degrees and five minutes (2° 5') east eighteen hundred ninety (1890) feet. Conkling Spring No. 2. Located in the SW 1/4 Section 11, Township 20 South, Range 70 West of the 6th P.M. in and near the channel of South Oak Creek at a point whence the southwest corner of said Section 11 bears north forty-eight degrees seven minutes (48° 7') east, a distance of fifteen hundred fifty eight (1558) feet. Conkling Spring No. 3 and Seep. Located in the SW 1/4 Section 11, Township 20 South, Range 70 West of the 6th P.M., lying 660 feet north of the south section line and 600 feet east of the west section line of said Section 11. Conkling Reservoir No.1. Conkling Reservoir No. 4. Conkling Reservoir No. 6. Conkling Reservoir No. 6 in the SW 1/4, Section 11, Township 20 South, Range 70 West of the 6th P.M., Fremont County, Colorado, lying approximately 1920 feet north of the south section line and 1240 feet east of the west section line of said Section 11. **Sources of Water.** Conkling Spring No. 2. Spring waters tributary to South Oak Creek, tributary to Oak Creek, tributary to the Arkansas River. Conkling Reservoirs Nos.1-4. Conkling Reservoirs Nos. 1 through 4 are on-stream reservoirs on South Oak Creek, tributary to Oak Creek, tributary to the Arkansas River. Conkling Reservoir No.6. Conkling Reservoir No. 6 is an off-channel reservoir that is filled by Conkling Reservoirs Nos. 1 through 4, Conkling Springs Nos. 1 through 3, and natural precipitation. **Appropriation Date.** December 31, 2011, for all structures and uses adjudicated in Case No. 11CW87. **Amounts.** Conkling Spring No.2. 3 g.p.m., conditional. Conkling Reservoir No.1. 9.2 acre feet, conditional. Conkling Reservoir No.2. 8.6 acre feet, conditional. Conkling Reservoir No.3. 8.0 acre feet, conditional. Conkling Reservoir No.4. 1.8 acre feet, conditional. Conkling Reservoir No.6. 2.31 acre feet, absolute; 7.69 acre feet conditional. **Uses.** Irrigation (all

structures). Additionally, Conkling Reservoir No.6 was decreed for domestic, livestock, piscatorial, wildlife habitat, and erosion control. **V. Detailed Outline of Diligence.** The Conkling Water Rights are part of Applicant's integrated water supply system, which consists of surface water rights and storage water rights. Pursuant to C.R.S. § 37-92-301(4)(b), work on one component of an integrated system shall be considered in finding that reasonable diligence has been shown for all components of the integrated system. During the subject diligence period, Applicant has outlaid the following expenditures or completed the following work related to the Conkling Water Rights and his integrated water system: Stored and released water from Conkling Reservoir No. 6 to irrigate fields below Conkling Reservoir No. 6. Excavated, constructed and plumbed a number of the Conkling Springs, including all water lines associated therewith to deliver the Conkling Springs to either irrigated fields or to storage. Planting and maintaining crops on Applicant's property by watering through the use of the water rights subject of this application. Hydro seeding across Applicant's property. Performed maintenance on the structures used to deliver water through the Applicant's integrated water system. Increased the capacity and lined Conkling Reservoir No. 6. Adjudicated additional water rights to irrigate Applicant's property in Case No. 20CW3075, District Court, Water Division 2. Conducted an aerial survey of entire farm. Conducted a drainage study for Fremont County. Completed construction projects on the farm including constructing a new 50'x100' processing building, installing new electrical service for building, constructing new ADA bathrooms with cistern and septic with new electrical service for bathrooms, erecting a new fence and gates for cultivation area, constructing a new guard shack at entrance to farm, and constructing a new 96'x40' secure storage area. Purchased and constructed a new mixing tank and plumbing for irrigation. Added 5 new meters of ditches to track water in, out, and onto fields. Hired a water resource engineer to develop an accounting sheet for Applicant's operation, including the water rights subject of this application. Applicant has further spent significant time and effort over the last six years developing his property, including the installation of roads, irrigation equipment, bridges, fencing, and buildings as part of the overall plan to irrigate Applicant's property. The total cost of the above listed actions was approximately \$933,378, including material, labor, and consulting costs. This is in addition to routine maintenance of all water rights. The applicant also incurred legal fees associated with drafting and filing of documents pertaining to the Conkling Water Rights, including previous related applications and decrees as well as the present filing, and obtaining legal advice. **VI. Claim to Make Absolute.** In light of the continuous diversion and application of water to beneficial use described in Section V above, Applicant seeks to make absolute the amounts decreed in Case No. 11CW87, as stated below: **Surface Water Storage. Conkling Reservoir No.6. Date water Applied to Beneficial Use:** June 1, 2014. **Amount:** An additional 4.39 acre feet, for a total of 6.7 acre-feet, absolute. **Use:** Pursuant to C.R.S. § 37-92-301(4)(e), all uses decreed in 11CW87, including irrigation, domestic, livestock, piscatorial, wildlife habitat, and erosion control. **Description of Place of Use Where Water is Applied to Beneficial Use:** Applicant's Property. **VII.** Applicant owns the land where Conkling Spring No. 2 and all Conkling Reservoirs are located and the beneficial use of the water from these sources will be within the Applicant's property.

Application for Change of Water Rights

PUEBLO COUNTY

II. Beulah Water Works District ("Beulah Water") and Pine Drive Water District ("Pine Drive"), (collectively "Districts"), desire to change the location of use of their respective water right interests to allow for both Beulah and Pine Drive to provide a backup water supply to each other during times when the other district is in need of additional water supplies. III. **BEULAH WATER: Name of Structure.** The name of the structure for which the change of water right is sought is the Fisher Ditch. **Information from Previous Decree. Date Entered.** The Fisher Ditch was decreed on June 26, 1893 by the original adjudication of the Pueblo County District Court in Case No. CA2756. **Decreed Point of Diversion.** Original decreed point of diversion was described as the left bank of the St. Charles River in the SE1/4 of the NW1/4 of Section 21, Township 22 South, Range 65 West, and from the headgate the SW corner of the SE1/4 of the NW1/4 of said Section 21 bears South 63°38' West, 184.8 feet, in Pueblo County, Colorado. **Source.** The original source of water for the Fisher Ditch was the St. Charles River, tributary to the Arkansas River. **Appropriation Date/Amounts.** The appropriation date and decreed amount for the Fisher Ditch is as follows, of which Beulah owns the entire water right ("Fisher Right"): May 1, 1864, Priority No. 13, for 0.7 cfs for irrigation. **Subsequent Case.** The Fisher Ditch point of diversion was changed to "[a] point on the South Bank of Middle Creek, a tributary of the St. Charles River located in the NE1/4 of the NE1/4 of Section 5, Township 23 South, Range 68 West of the 6th Principal Meridian; whence the north-east corner of the said Section 5 bears N. 57°32'40" E., a distance of 972.52 feet" in Case No. CA39066, District Court, Pueblo County. This is the current point of diversion for the Fisher Ditch located at UTM Zone 13 NAD83, Easting: 498580, Northing: 4215002. The decree in Case No. CA39066 also changed the use of the Fisher Ditch water right to domestic, manufacturing, and irrigation purposes within the boundaries of Beulah Water. **Description of Proposed Change.** Beulah Water seeks to change the place of use for the Fisher Ditch water right to allow for it to also be used within the boundaries of Pine Drive, as such boundaries currently exist or as they may be amended in the future. **PINE DRIVE: Name of Structure.** The name of the structure for which the change of water right is sought is Pine Drive's interest in the Eureka Ditch. **Information from Previous Decree. Date Entered.** The Eureka Ditch was decreed on June 26, 1893 by the original adjudication of the Pueblo County District Court in Case No. CA2756. **Decreed Point of Diversion.** Original decreed point of diversion was described as the southeast bank of the St. Charles River in the SW1/4 of the SE1/4 of Section 20, Township 22 South, Range 65 West, in Pueblo County, Colorado, at a point North 9°30' East 17 chains or 68 rods from quarter section corner on the South line of said Section 20, between the SE quarter and the SW quarter of said section. **Source.** The original source of water for the Eureka Ditch was the St. Charles River, tributary to the Arkansas River. **Appropriation**

Date/Amounts. The appropriation date and decreed amount for the Eureka Ditch is as follows, of which Pine Drive is the owner of 0.1 cfs ("Eureka Right"): December 31, 1861, Priority No. 4, for 0.9 cfs for irrigation and domestic purposes. Subsequent Cases. *Case No. CA6421, Pueblo County District Court.* The point of diversion for the entirety of the Eureka Ditch water right was changed to the St. Charles Ditch, diverting from the St. Charles River. The use of the Eureka Ditch water right was also changed to be stored and used for operating and maintaining the steel works within the City of Pueblo, including sanitary and manufacturing purposes. *Case No. CA19936, Pueblo County District Court.* The point of diversion for the entirety of the Eureka Ditch water right was changed to the St. Charles Flood Ditch, diverting from the St. Charles River. *Case No. W-4578, District Court, Water Division No. 2:* 0.1 cfs of the Eureka Ditch water right was changed to an alternate point of diversion by an infiltration gallery on the North Fork of the St. Charles River, located in the SE1/4 of Section 2, Township 23 South, Range 68 West of the 6th P.M., in Pueblo County, Colorado. This is the current location of the point of diversion for the Eureka Right by means of the infiltration gallery, which is specifically located at UTM Zone 13 NAD83, Easting: 503398, Northing: 4213738. *Case No. 2003CW14, District Court, Water Division No. 2:* Alternate points of diversion for the 0.1 cfs of the Eureka Ditch water right were awarded for two wells: The St. Charles Headgate Well and the Wagner Headgate Well, both located in the SE1/4 of the SE1/4 of Section 2, Township 23 South, Range 68 West of the 6th P.M. This is the current location for both wells, which are specifically located as follows: St. Charles Headgate Well: UTM Zone 13 NAD83, Easting: 503409.7, Northing: 4213717.9. Wagner Headgate Well: UTM Zone 13 NAD83, Easting: 503375.9, Northing: 4213716.1. Description of Proposed Change. Pine Drive seeks to change the place of use for its 0.1 cfs interest in the Eureka Ditch water right to allow for it to also be used within the boundaries of Beulah Water, as such boundaries currently exist or as they may be amended in the future. Historical Use. The Fisher Right has been used by Beulah Water from 1958 to the present, based on CDSS records, for water provision to residential lots within the boundaries of Beulah Water. The Eureka Right has been used by Pine Drive from 1982 to the present, based on CDSS records, for water provision to residential lots within the boundaries of Pine Drive. The Applicants will evaluate the Fisher Right and Eureka Right using a study period commensurate with their above times of use. The Districts divert, treat, and deliver water to their customers. The wastewater is treated by means of individual, on-site, non-evaporative septic systems. Outdoor use is both restricted and minimal in the Districts. A map of the locations of the Districts and the diversion points for the subject water rights is attached to the application as **Exhibit A.** (All exhibits mentioned herein are incorporated by reference and may be inspected at the office of the clerk of this Court.) A summary of diversion records for both Beulah Water and Pine Drive is attached hereto as **Exhibit B.** Total annual water use and consumptive use by the Districts will remain consistent with historical use. Return Flows. As the historical water use by the Districts will not change and the overall location of the Districts being in the Beulah Valley and being adjacent to each other, the timing and amount of depletions to the North St. Charles River and subsequently the St. Charles River will not change. Names and Addresses of Owners of Land Upon Which Structures are Located. The current owner of the land where the Fisher Ditch headgate is located is Ivan Davison, whose address is 358 W. Palmer Lake Drive,

Pueblo West, Colorado 81007. The current owner of the land where the Eureka Right is diverted is the Co-Applicant, Pine Drive.

Application for Findings of Reasonable Diligence

HUERFANO COUNTY

2. Summary of Application. La Veta seeks a finding of reasonable diligence for the water right decreed to the La Veta Mexican Ditch appropriative right of exchange (La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right). **3. Description of La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right.** **a.** Original Decree. July 19, 2010, Case No. 00CW130, Water Division 2 (00CW130 Decree). **b.** Subsequent Diligence Decree. October 3, 2018, Case No. 17CW3048, Water Division 2 (17CW3048 Decree). **c.** Legal Description. **i.** Downstream Terminus. The downstream terminus of the exchange reach is the point of diversion for the Mexican Ditch, located in the NE¼ NW¼ of Section 31, Township 27 South, Range 65 West of the 6th P.M. (WDID 1600604, UTM’s 524729E, 4166990N (NAD 83)). **ii.** Upstream Terminus. The upstream terminus is up the Cucharas River at the point of diversion for the La Veta Pipeline, located at a point on the east bank of the Cucharas River bearing south 71° 23’ west 2,862 feet from the east quarter corner of Section 5, Township 30 South, Range 68 West of the 6th P.M. (WDID 1600585, UTM’s 497828E, 4146630N (NAD 83)). See map attached to the application as **EXHIBIT A.** (All exhibits mentioned herein are incorporated by reference and may be inspected at the office of the clerk of this Court.) **d.** Appropriation Date. December 5, 2000. **e.** Source. Cucharas River, limited to La Veta’s consumptive use portion of the change of water right for the Mexican Ditch water right approved by the 00CW130 Decree. **f.** Amount. 0.96 cubic feet per second. **4. Diligence Claim.** **a.** Diligence Period. From October 3, 2018, the date the 17CW3048 Decree was entered, through October 31, 2024 (Diligence Period). **b.** Activities and Expenditures. During the Diligence Period, La Veta completed activities and expended approximately One Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand dollars (\$175,000.00) to protect and develop La Veta’s water rights, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right. These activities and expenditures confirm La Veta’s steady and diligent efforts to complete the appropriation of the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right and include: **i.** Dry-Up of Irrigated Lands to Allow Exchange to La Veta Town Reservoir. La Veta’s water engineer continued work identifying lands irrigated by La Veta’s changed Mexican Ditch water rights that will be dried up so the water can be exchanged to the La Veta Town Reservoir, through use of the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right. **ii.** Maintenance of Structures. La Veta conducted maintenance activities to ensure continued water deliveries under La Veta’s portfolio of water rights, including: (1) installation of radio read meters for La Veta’s water supply system; (2) repairs to headgates; (3) replacement of filter media and turbidity meters at La Veta’s water treatment plant; and (4) construction of a main line extension to new facilities annexed into La Veta. **iii.** Management of La Veta’s Water Rights Portfolio. La Veta actively managed its water rights portfolio, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right, to maximize long-term beneficial

use, including dealing with: (1) annexation issues; and (2) water treatment plant permitting issues. **iv.** Monitoring of Division 2 Water Court Resumes. La Veta monitored Division 2 resumes and Substitute Water Supply Plan notices for new water right applications to determine if the operations proposed by these applications would result in injury to La Veta's water rights, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right. **v.** Water Court Application. La Veta actively managed its water rights portfolio by filing the following applications: **(1)** La Veta Town Reservoir Enlargement Application. On November 30, 2023, La Veta filed an application in Water Division 2 Case No. 23CW3050 (23CW3050 Application). The 23CW3050 Application sought findings of reasonable diligence for the 150 acre-feet of water right decreed to the La Veta Town Reservoir Enlargement. The 23CW3050 Application was approved by decree entered June 7, 2024. **(2)** La Veta, Cucharas WSD, and Huerfano County Joint Water Court Application. On December 29, 2017, La Veta, the Cucharas Sanitation & Water District, and Huerfano County Water filed a joint application for conditional storage rights and conditional appropriative rights of exchange in Water Division 2 Case No. 17CW3075 (17CW3075 Joint Application). The 17CW3075 Joint Application was approved by the decree entered July 13, 2020 (17CW3075 Decree). La Veta completed and has participated under the terms of the agreement required in paragraph 8.4 of the 17CW3075 Decree. **vi.** Water Court Oppositions. La Veta actively participated in the following Division 2 Water Court cases to protect La Veta's water rights, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right: **(1)** Case No. 17CW3063 (decree entered September 18, 2020). **(2)** Case No. 19CW3070 (decree entered August 23, 2021). **(3)** Case No. 19CW3028 (decree entered July 22, 2021). **vii.** Review of 2020 Division 2 Abandonment List. La Veta reviewed the Division 2 2020 water rights abandonment list to ensure La Veta's water rights, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right, were not improperly listed as abandoned. **5. La Veta's Integrated Water Supply System.** The 17CW3048 Decree confirms La Veta's water system, including the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right, are part of an integrated water supply system under C.R.S. § 37-92-301(4)(b), and work on other components of La Veta's integrated municipal water supply system is evidence of diligence on the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right. **6. 00CW130 and 17CW3048 Terms.** All terms and conditions reached through stipulations with parties in the 00CW130 Decree and the 17CW3048 Decree will be incorporated as part of the final decree in this matter. **7. Names and Addresses of Owners or Reputed Owners of Land Upon Which Any New Diversion or Storage Structure Will Be Located.** No new diversion or storage structure is required for operation of the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right. **8. Requested Ruling.** La Veta respectfully requests the Water Court enter a decree: **(a)** finding the activities outlined above support a finding of reasonable diligence as to all conditional amounts of the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right; **(b)** continuing the full amount of the conditional portion of the La Veta Mexican Ditch Exchange Right for an additional diligence period; and **(c)** such other and further relief as the Court deems appropriate.
