It is ordered that the following bond schedule shall be effective immediately throughout the courts of the Twelfth Judicial District. This bond schedule shall be used by law enforcement officers when an arrest occurs without an arrest warrant. Such schedule is not to be used by a judge when setting or modifying bond pursuant to the mandates of C.R.S. §§ 16-4-101, *et seq.*

**Parolees arrested for new offenses:** No bond or bail shall be set for a person who is on parole and charged with a new offense involving any felony or drug felony excluding simple possession, any offense involving a weapon, any offense involving domestic violence, or any offense in which bodily injury or more serious harm was caused to another person. A person on parole shall not be released until her or his parole officer has been notified of the arrest.

The officer shall not arrest a person for possession of any miniscule, residual, or unusable amount of a controlled substance that may be present in a used hypodermic needle, syringe or other drug paraphernalia.

**Violations involving Domestic Violence:** All persons charged with a crime involving domestic violence shall be arrested and shall not be released on bail or on bond until a judge has advised the person concerning the terms of the mandatory protection order and until the person has acknowledged the restraining order as a condition of bond.

**Fish, Game, and Wildlife Offenses:** For any violation classified as a felony or misdemeanor, use the above schedules to set the appropriate bonds. If the violation is not classified, set bail at the amount equal to the fine defined by statute.

NOTES

1. When a defendant is arrested, the arresting officer or jail deputy shall set bail according to the above schedules. Such bail will remain in force until the defendant is brought before a judge for advisement (within 48 hours of the defendant's arrival at the jail or detention facility).
2. When a defendant is arrested for more than one offense, the arresting officer or jail deputy shall set bail for the highest/most serious offense alleged according to the above schedules. Bail shall not be accumulated.
3. If a warrant or approved probable cause statement sets a bail or bond that is different than the schedule amount for that offense, the amount stated on the warrant or approved probable cause statement shall prevail.
4. All persons arrested on warrants issued in a civil case shall be required to post the bond set by the warrant.
5. All bonds accepted per these schedules shall command the defendant to appear in court at a date and time certain, which shall be the court's regularly-scheduled arraignment day or the court's next business day as the court may direct. If a summons is issued, then the return date on the bond shall be the same date set on the Summons. If the court has set an appearance date, then the return date on the bond shall be the date and time set by the court.
6. Any person who does not post bond shall be taken to court for advisement as soon as possible but in no event later than 48 hours following her or his arrival to the jail or detention center.
8. Law enforcement officials in the Twelfth Judicial District, or their authorized deputies, may release an arrested person only upon posting of the required bond unless otherwise authorized by a judge.
9. All prior bond schedules used or relied upon are hereby rescinded, null, and void.
